MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

Last week I attended the presidential inauguration at the Union Buildings with great excitement. It was wonderful to meet Mamma Joy, who radiated almost as much enthusiasm as the entire amphitheatre.

The fresh, early start to the day was symbolic of a new page being turned in South Africa's history - one where the people are demonstrating a wish to take action and witness much-needed change under the 7th administration of our democratic republic.



At a time when our decarbonisation targets are slipping away from us, it was important to hear the President reconfirm his commitment to a Net-Zero ambition. He said, "We will accept our responsibility to respond to climate change in a manner that is ambitious, just and inclusive." 
